



**Synopsis**

*A snapshot of the chapter*

Luke chapter twelve brings us some of the very personal teaching of Jesus. It both instructs and encourages those who wish to be His followers. Those willing to confess Him need not be afraid of others because God will care for them. Neither do we need to worry about the things of life because God provides what is needed. There are two parables in this chapter. The first (v. 13-21) is about a man who put his trust in earthly riches but is told he will die and all his wealth will be given to others. The second (v. 35-40) encourages disciples to always be faithful and keep their lives ready for the Lord to come.
