



## Synopsis

## *A snapshot of the chapter*

The final chapter of Luke is focused on the miraculous, bodily resurrection of Jesus. This singular event establishing His divinity forms the unique aspect of Christianity which rises above all other world religions. Luke provides three brief historical essays dealing with this resurrection: (1) the presence of disciples at the empty tomb of Jesus on the morning of the first day of the week and their witness to Jesus' words that He would rise again (1-12); Jesus' appearance to two men on the road between Jerusalem and Emmaus (13-35); and Jesus' final appearance and instructions followed by His ascension back to heaven (36-53).
