

Tell Me the Story of Jesus

Lesson 25 - Acts 01

People — Who is involved?

The author – Luke
The original recipient – Theophilus
Jesus – speaking to His apostles
The apostles – hearing His last instructions and
seeing Jesus ascend.
120 disciples including the apostles (vs. 15).

Places — Where does it happen?

The ascension of Jesus takes place from the Mount of Olives (vs. 12).

The meeting of the disciples was in an upper room in Jerusalem (vs. 12-13).

Pearls — What information will help me to understand better?

- Intro –This book is entitled "Acts of the Apostles." Actually, it contains only some of the acts of some of the apostles...primarily those of Peter (1-12) and Paul (13-28).
- Intro The author is Luke, the same author who wrote to Theophilus in the Gospel narrative.
- Intro The purpose of the book is to chronicle the first thirty years of Christianity showing how that the gospel was taken to the whole world.
- Intro By the use of 1st person pronoun "we," it appears that Luke was personally with Paul at least in that part of Acts discussed in 16:10-17; 20:5-21; and 27:1-28.
- Intro The book of Acts provides the background and setting for 13 of Paul's epistles.
- Intro The book of Acts records five visits of Paul to Jerusalem (9:26f; 11:28f; 15:1f; 18:21f; 21:15f).
- Intro The student will want to look for twenty-four public addresses and/or excerpts from sermons.
- Intro Like Genesis, this is a book of beginnings: beginning of the Christian age,"the last days"; the beginning of preaching the gospel and the salvation of men in Christ; the beginning of the Holy Spirit's work among the apostles; and the beginning of the church of Christ.
- Vs 5 Here we have a promise to the apostles. In 2:33 a promise to Christ is mentioned. In 2:38 a promise to those who are baptized is to be remembered.
- Vs 8 This verse contains the theme statement for the book of Acts: "You shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem" (chap. 1-7); "in all Judea and Samaria" (chap. 8-12); and "to the end of the earth" (13-28). Notice also, this verse mentions the Holy Spirit whose work is also an important theme.
- Vs 16 Jesus appears to be referring to Psalm 41:9 here.
- Vs 18 Judas hanged himself (Matt. 27:5). This is further detail on what happened to his body afterward
- Vs 21 The criteria for selection of the apostle to take Judas' place is here recorded.

Perspectives - What may I learn from this chapter?

- 1. The apostles were to wait in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit's power to come upon them.
- 2. Jesus clearly had a plan for the apostles to carry the gospel to the whole world.
- 3. There was a successor to Judas who died before the gospel was offered to man, but there have been no other successors to the apostles because they could not meet the qualifications.
